Sunday, 8 Apr 2018: Second Sunday of Easter - (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Jn 20:19-31 A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

After eight days, Jesus came in and stood among them.

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

Literal Sense - These final two verses of Sunday's gospel passage (Jn 20:30-31) read like the conclusion to the whole gospel. These verses pronounce what it means to have faith and what John wanted those who listen to understand.



Spiritual Sense - The gospel recognises that to believe in the resurrection without that physical, personal encounter with Jesus is to be celebrated even more. Happy are we – blessed are we – who have not seen and yet still believe!

Application Sense - The community is the body of Christ, we touch the wounds of Christ when we touch the wounds of the community, when we go out to the sick and those who are hurt. As shocking as these wounds may appear, they are really glorious, because the Risen Lord has identified with them and has made them his own.
