A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 9:11-17 *They all ate and were filled*.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

# **Sacrament of Confirmation**

St Oliver's Parish Harris Park invites you to enrol your child for the Sacrament of Confirmation as the final step for completion of the Sacraments of Initiation. This will take place through a Parish Based and Family Centred process. That means that it is you who do the preparation with your child but we help you with this through a process of guided reflection.

To be eligible for preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation at this time your child must be <u>10 years of age by 30th</u> <u>of June 2019</u> and <u>have made their Reconciliation and First Eucharist.</u> While this is the minimum age for children to join in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation, it is important to note that there is no maximum age for children who have been baptized as infants to complete their Initiation into our Faith Community.

It is important for you to discern if your child is ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at this time. Please note that preparation is held in conjunction with St Patrick's Cathedral Parramatta.


Should you wish to purchase a sibling photograph online, the order must be placed no later than the day before photography day. Sibling photographs will only be taken if an order has been placed.

### Understanding Your Child's Report

Reporting time has come around once again. Before you look over your child's report, we would like to explain the grading scale that constitutes a part of our reporting. As you know, your child's achievement for each Key Learning Area (KLA) is reported using a five point scale. The five point grade scale can be used to report student achievement in both primary and junior secondary years in all NSW schools.

The curriculum is clustered into stages of learning outcomes for each KLA. Kindergarten has their own outcomes to achieve by the end of the year. Every other year group has two years to achieve the outcomes in each KLA for their stage. Therefore, it is not unusual to see a slight drop in grades at the start of each stage of learning because they are working on new outcomes in each KLA. The learning outcomes are grouped as follows:

Early Stage 1 - Kindergarten Stage 1 - Year 1 and Year 2 Stage 2 - Year 3 and Year 4 Stage 3 - Year 5 and Year 6 Stage 4 - Year 7 and Year 8 Stage 5 - Year 9 and Year 10 Stage 6 - Year 11 and Year 12

The scale is designed to be broad so that it is able to reflect even the most capable student who is in actual fact working well beyond the expected grade level. To explain it further:

## A

The student has an **extensive knowledge and understanding** of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

#### В

The student has a **thorough knowledge and understanding** of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

## С

The student has a **sound knowledge and understanding** of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

#### D

The student has a **basic knowledge and understanding** of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.

#### E

The student has an **elementary knowledge and understanding** in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.
