KISS and GO trial in Week 9 and 10 - 16th Sept - 27th Sept

In Week 9 and Week 10 we are trialling KISS and GO in the afternoons in the 5 minute parking zone on Allen Street. This is in response to our lack of parking. We will then seek parent feedback after the trial.

Kiss and Go

In the afternoon, the 5 minute parking zone on Allen Street, will be in use for KISS and GO. Staff will supervise.

• Parents who pull up in the KISS and GO zone must stay in their car.

KISS and GO Procedures for Parents

- Parents can pull up in the KISS and GO bay from 2:55pm. As this is a 5 minute zone, parents risk a fine if stopped there for more than 5 minutes.
- KISS and GO will run from 3pm to 3:30pm
- Display family sign in front left visor of your car (provided by the school)
- Students will only be directed into the first car for safety reasons
- · Parents must remain in the car
- Students enter the car from the gutter side ONLY
- Bags must go in the car, NOT the boot due to safety reasons
- The last car in the KISS and GO bay must be completely in front of the bicycle sign painted on the road
- If the KISS and GO bay is full, parents will be directed to drive around the block and rejoin the queue
- Parents are advised to adhere to road rules and parking signs to avoid fines
- Please note, parents must not leave the bay until ALL passengers have a seat belt on.
- It is an offence to be on mobile phones while in the KISS and GO bay
- Wet weather KISS and GO proceeds as normal

KISS and GO Procedures for Students.

- KISS and GO students proceed to the Kinder seats at 3pm, before other students are dismissed
- Students wait on kinder seats with siblings until called by duty teacher
- Students proceed to the gate when called and are then directed by the duty teacher to their car when their car is in the front position in the bay
- Wet weather students assemble under shade awning
- After 3.30pm, parents will need to park & walk into the school to pick up their child

NSW Scouts will also be there to promote their youth programs to parents.


