
Gospel - Matthew 4:1-11

Lent Week 1 - Ash Wednesday February 26 to Sunday March 1 2020 CEDP LENTEN REFLECTIONS

'The Temptation in the Wilderness' by Briton Riviere

At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the force of darkness. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry.

The tempter approached and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread." Jesus said in reply, "It is written: One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."



Then Jesus was taken to the holy city and made to stand on the parapet of the temple. The evil one said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down. For it is written: God will command the angels concerning you and with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone."

Jesus answered him, "Again it is written,

You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test."

EXTENDED LEAVE and ILLNESS

If you are planning any extended leave throughout the year (5 days or more), an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed before leave is taken. These are available from the school office. The application is sent to the principal for approval.

If your child is away for a day or more, a note of explanation to the class teacher is required. You can also use the Skoolbag app to submit an absentee form through **eforms**.

SKOOLBAG APP

Skoolbag is a mobile app that communicates directly to parents smartphones. It allows the school to keep you up to date with the latest news, notices, alerts, newsletters etc. The Skoolbag app is free to download. Download it today. NUT FREE ENVIRONMENT

Due to many of our children suffering from severe allergies we are a *nut free school*. Please refrain from sending any food containing nuts to school with your child. This includes peanut butter, nutella, muesli bars with nuts and any food containing nuts or traces of nuts. Please read packaging carefully. Thank you for your understanding.



NO PARKING

Signage in Allen Street outside Church Gate

- You must not stop for more than two minutes in a No Parking Area.
- You must remain in your car or within 3 metres of the vehicle.
- This means that you can drop your child off in the morning in this zone, but must stay in the car or walk around to let your children out of the car (but stay within 3 metres of the car). Children must then walk themselves into school via the gate next to the Church. You can be booked if you move away from your car by more than 2 metres.
- If using Kiss and Go in the afternoon, you can pull up in this zone and wait in your car for Kiss and Go to commence.
- If you park and leave your car between 8am-9.30am and 2.30pm-4.00pm you are at risk of being booked.
- Unfortunately some of our families have already been booked for parking in this zone and leaving their car.

The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading and to enable students to experience quality literature.


All St Oliver's children have received their paper Reading Record. Please record the Title and Author of each book read. The first column, PRC ID, is not required.




Possum in the house
