
I look forward to meeting families in the future and ask God to continue to bless our school community as we embark onto Term 3.

Saint Oliver Plunkett our community Patron Saint

Saint Oliver Plunkett (1st November 1625 - 1st July 1681) was the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland. He maintained his duties in Ireland in the face of English persecution and was eventually arrested and tried for treason in London. He was hanged, drawn and quartered at Tyburn on 1 July 1681, and became the last Roman Catholic martyr to die in England. Oliver Plunkett was beatified in 1920 and canonised in 1975, the first new Irish saint for almost seven hundred years. As a community we celebrate the legacy, life and intercession in our lives of Saint Oliver at our Multicultural Day.



NAIDOC Week 2021 July 4-11



NAIDOC originally stood for 'National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee'. This committee was once responsible for organising national activities during NAIDOC Week and its acronym has since become the name of the week itself.

NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. The week is a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities and to support your local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community. Throughout the coming weeks classes will engage in a broad range of topics, and learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives.

Sacrament of Confirmation - Sunday 21st November Registration

Registration for candidates into the Sacrament of Confirmation 2021 are now open. The Sacrament of Confirmation is the final step for completion of the Sacraments of Initiation. To be eligible for preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation at this time your child must be 10 years of age by 30th of June 2021 and have made their Reconciliation and First Eucharist. While this is the minimum age for children to join



in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation, it is important to note that there is no maximum age for children who have been baptized as infants to complete their Initiation into our Faith Community. It is important for you to discern if your child is ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at this time. The Sacrament of Confirmation program is also supported by learning in the classroom in Year 6, Term 4 as they participate in the cycle of learning in which they inquire 'What is my existential purpose?.

The family centered program will begin in Term 3 and throughout Term 4 with the ceremony taking place on Sunday 21st November.

ZOOM - Video Conferencing

Congratulations must go to all our parents and students for your hard work with remote learning. It has been great to see our students participating in our Zoom sessions.

Below are some helpful hints for your family to assist in using ZOOM conferencing at home. We recommend that you take the time to explore and discuss these with your child. It is important that during this period of home learning we maintain safe and responsible use of information and communication technologies. Normal school protocols, privacy and information protection and respectful communication must be observed when students are communicating with peers and teachers via video conferencing e.g Zoom.

Before the lesson starts

- ★ Your child should be dressed appropriately.
- ★ Ensure that your child has audio turned off unless invited by the teacher.
- ★ Talk with your child that the rules used at school also apply in a virtual classroom, and poor or unacceptable behaviour will carry consequences.
- ★ Provide a quiet space to meet online using an internet enabled device

Ensure others in your house know your child will be in a Zoom session video conference.

★ Make family members and the student aware that they can be heard by the whole class if speaking too close to the microphone. *Parents can help with siblings and other family members while the Zoom is going to help make sure that there are no distractions.*

Make sure that your child is in a room *clear of things that might impinge on your family's privacy*.

What to look for while students are online in a structured lesson

- ★ Make sure that they are on task and using the computer for the correct reasons. Rarely would a game like "MineCraft" be played during a video conference. Your child should be engaged in the lesson. This would include active listening, asking questions and completing online exercises.
- ★ Ensure your child is working with the *computer in an ergonomic manner*. For example, sitting in a chair, back straight, feet flat on the floor and screen adjusted to a comfortable height.
